Alberto Torres



Alberto Torres (Toledo, Spain 1979) is a Madrid-based composer, songwriter and producer. His compositions for fiction have been heard in series of worldwide success as "Toy Boy" (Netflix/Atresmedia) and they have earned him a nomination for the Ariel Award from the Mexican Film Academy for the Original Music of the film "Buy me a gun" (Julio Hernández Cordon, 2019). He won the Goya Award 2022 from the spanish Film Academy with the documentary shortfilm "Mama" (Pablo de la Chica, 2021). He also received the Berlinale Talent in 2022 and premiered the Costa Rican film "Domingo and the mist" (Ariel Escalante, 2022) at the Cannes Film Festival. In 2023, he was nominated for the Goya Award again with the short film "The Handover" (Pedro Díaz, 2022) for Best Fiction Shortfilm. He just finished the second season of the hit HBO series "One way or another" (Manuela Moreno, 2023).



Undergraduate Degree in Journalism, (Complutense University of Madrid) History and Sciences of Music (University of La Rioja) and Undergraduate Degree in Piano and Music Language (Jacinto Guerrero Conservatory of Toledo). Alberto has composed scores for film and television exploring varied musical genres, pushing boundaries through a bold and, at times, experimental lens. His classical training and his experience in pop music have allowed him to take on many varied projects, ranging from experimental electronic music, orchestral scores, flamenco or indie rock, collaborating with artists like Steve Shelley and Lee Ranaldo from Sonic Youth, Rosalia or Niño de Elche. Internationally, he has worked on productions in Mexico, Germany, Colombia, Cuba, France, Costa Rica or El Salvador. His film scores have been featured at some of the most renown film festivals around the world: Cannes,

Locarno, MoMA New York, San Sebastian, Toronto, Sao Paulo, Bafici Buenos Aires among others.

Likewise, Alberto is a professor of Music and Technology in Contemporary Music Composition Degree and Soundtracks for directors in Cinematography Degree at TAI ARTS Universitary Centre (Madrid). He also teaches Music Production in Composition for Audiovisual Media Degree at Música Creativa Universitary Centre (Madrid). Has chaired various workshops (Cinesonico Lab) and conferences in Spain (La Casa Encendida in Madrid, La Térmica in Malaga) and Latin America (Icaro International Film Fest in Nicaragua, Suchitoto International Film Festival in El Salvador, Cultural Center of Spain in San Salvador, MARTE Museum of Art Contemporary from El Salvador). He is a member of the European and Mexican Film Academy.







